

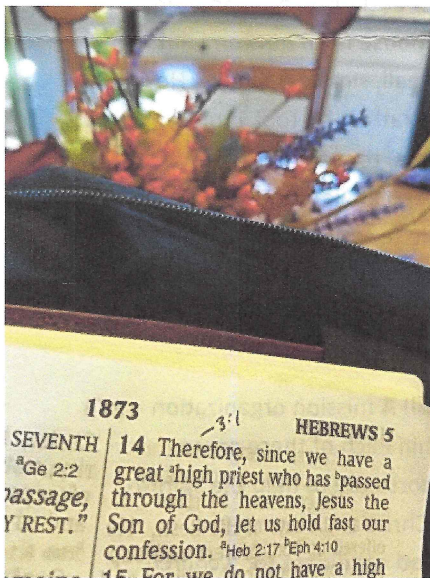

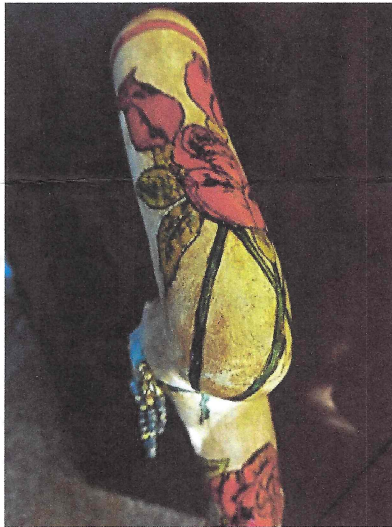

As Helen and I minister at the home office for TBM, the work which we do enables our missionaries to stay on the field, and results in stories which they share. The goal for TBM missionaries is to plant churches and to see spiritual growth in the lives of the people. The following is an excerpt from a prayer letter of a TBM missionary named Brad Harris, serving in Kenya.

### God's Workings: One life in Kenya, Africa

I want to share something with you, that was an encouragement to me, and hopefully will be for you too! Ptor Boniface is who we might call a "point pastor." Not long after we started a discipleship class at a local church in his area back in March 2014, problems arose regarding the color of my skin. The people (particularly the overseeing "bishop" of the area) insisted that I must be helping him (Pastor Boniface) financially, and unless he was willing to share the wealth, I would not be welcome to continue coming.

Pastor Boniface was initially underneath this bishop, and so in an effort to respect his authority, but continue learning more about the Lord and His Word-he told me we would be meeting at his house from now on. But when I showed up at his house the following week, he had constructed a separate small, simple building. He did not bring the problem for me to handle, and he did not ask me for anything - but rather, he took it upon himself, sacrificing of his own time, trouble, and resources, to build this structure for us to meet in. Subsequently, Pastor Boniface ended up leaving the religious denomination that he had been affiliated with, finding that it did not line up with Scripture, or teach the truth. He wanted to become a Bible teaching church. So, they began to meet in the small, simple structure that he had erected on his own, in order to host our weekly meetings. I was very encouraged to see him do these things on his own. He was truly taking steps of faith, to follow what He believed the Lord was calling him to do.

Well, about 2 weeks ago, something really exciting happened...that encouraged us all! A mission organization came to do a "medical camp" in his area about a year ago. It goes to stand, that within each of these areas where they seek to help the physical needs of the people - they also use it as an opportunity to help the spiritual needs of those same people. And when someone has become a brand-new baby Christian, they need a church family to grow in. They asked around of the leadership who might make a good candidate for a church building in that area - and Pastor Boniface was suggested. They said they have really seen change and growth in his life, for the things of the Lord, and in His Word. And even maturing in the ministry: His faithfulness and desire to serve the Lord, and His people is evident. So, this organization gave the money for him to build a church. But being that he already had the small, simple structure he had already raised himself - they were to build on and add to the building that was already existing.

Again, one of the biggest blessings (to me personally), is how it was truly the Lord Who provided for the needs of His people, without him having to advertise anything at all! He did not have to ask, or seek after anything but the Lord - and He was found Faithful and True. The Lord is the One Who put it on the hearts of people, to help by building a structure for a church to meet in. And it was the Lord Who helped others to see him as someone who could practically use that church building, and be used of the Lord to build others up by edifying and encouraging the saints. For sure, this new church building has been used in the building up of his faith!

Praise the Lord for the growth and maturity happening in Pastor Boniface's life! And Praise the Lord for HIS faithfulness!
