Praying and planning.

Another aspect to planning is hosting our annual Candidate School. This May, TBM is considering several candidates for both full-time and short-term service. We have been and will continue to domuch of the preliminary work to prepare for Candidate School and interviews . Please pray for God's leading in our planning and His guidance for each candidate.

Serving locally.

God has given Sarah and I each unique service opportunities locally that help us to stay aware of the need for sharing the Gospel and to remain alert to what TBM's field missionaries do on a daily basis. Sarah has had many opportunities to be a light and a blessing as she finishes her last year of training to be a teacher. We pray that in the future God will provide her with a place to teach where she can be effective in this way. I (Ben) have spent Sundays over the last six months or so teaching Sunday School through 1, 2, and 3 John. This has been a great time of learning and growth for all of us.

Networking.

TBM's Home Office has two guest rooms that we use to house missionaries from many different organizations while they are in town or passing through. This has given us time to talk and network with these missionaries, allowing us to bounce thoughts and ideas off of each other for how we can be more effective in what we do.

Working for efficiency.

One of the things I enjoy doing in the Home Office is finding ways to do what we do better. In the last few months we have overhauled our phone and internet systems, giving us more functionality at a cheaper price! Another way that we are hoping to be more efficient is through building additional space onto our Home Office building. This will provide meeting space for gatherings of students from Frontier School of the Bible, for other missions organizations needing a place to meet, and space for our own TBM Board meetings. It will also give us more office space as our Home Office Staff expands in the future. Last Fall, we had begun excavation for this building addition when plans and timing began to fall through, leading us to pause construction until God provides both funding and the right timing. Please pray with us that God will show us the right time to complete this project.
