As we look back and reflect on the year 2016-we are reminded of God's goodness and faithfulness to us always. We would like to share just a few of the "highlights" of this past year with you.

We actually spent the first month of 2016 still stateside, preparing for our return to Kenya. We had the honor of welcoming in the new year with family, but were back in Kenya even before the end of January.

We then spent the first few months getting settled/situated into a rhythm and routine of our lives in Kenya, after being back in the states for furlough for almost a whole year! Most of the "ministries" that happened in this time period resulted naturally from simply living life (seeking to serve Him in all things), and loving people (as we shared the love of Jesus with them). The Lord provided plenty of ample opportunities to witness for Christ to those people placed right in front of our faces: neighbors/and their employees, the groundskeepers, etc. and we were both blessed and challenged by the reminder that the way we live our very lives is ministry...as unto the Lord, and not unto men.

But then we became more busy with more "formal/full-time" ministries:

In June we had the largest group yet, of students from Frontier School of the Bible, come to minister alongside our family for 2 weeks. We are grateful to God for the open door and the opportunities to be fellow workers with students, faculty, etc. from the Bible School where we attended, and friends and colaborers in Kenya.

My sister LeAnn, was one of the group, and she stayed on after they left to complete a 6 month internship here in Kenya. She was a blessing to so many, in various ways; the Kenyan women/people, the missionary community, and our personal family.

My mom and brother also came to visit for a couple of weeks in August. It was a beautiful and blessed time to be able to be together on this side of the world!

In October, Becci Rohrer (a former intern and friend) also came back for a visit while LeAnn was here, and stayed for a month. It was really special being able to see and spend some time with her again!

Becci left in November, and LeAnn left in December-and both are going back to the states with the prayer that the Lord will guide and direct their next steps in this new year...back to Kenya, if it is His will. We consider it a privilege to have been ANY part of the process that the Lord used to lead these young women, in the way He wants them to go.

Meanwhile, we have continued with the main ministries of teaching/discipling the pastors that the Lord puts in front of us, and teaching/discipling our children where He has done the same. The Lord continues to teach Ellie and I a lot from the counseling we did when we were back in the states about a year ago, and we have been really encouraged to see how the Lord has allowed us to implement some of the things we have learned regarding "heart issues" and not just "head knowledge," into both my teaching times with the pastors, and things at home.

The year of 2016 seemed like a long year, though the same 12 months has past, it seems so full, and yet so fast at the same time?! This has only been a glimpse of some of the things God has been doing in and through us here. We look forward to what the future holds and eagerly await what the Lord has planned for us...in His time. We are so grateful to play a part in His perfect plan-and thank Him for your part as well. Thank you for ALL your faithful support; through financial giving, prayers, and encouragements. The Lord has used you in our lives, and His work here...and we are grateful. May He bless you and

keep you in perfect peace, as you fix your mind on Him this year...and always. Happy new year!!!
