We also got to visit with one of Ronnie's aunts in Atlanta whom he had not seen in over 30 years. We then spent a few days in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee with Meela's other brother, which was



very refreshing, and then spent some time visiting friends and other family members in Atlanta and South Florida. Three weeks flew by fast and we covered a lot of miles starting and ending in Florida. It was truly a lot of fun. We even got to visit Disney World and Sea World and are especially thankful to some of our family and friends who helped with some of these expenses. We are ever so grateful for their kindness.
