We have 150 campers ranging from 7 to 14 coming from the surrounding communities. Ashton will be a monitor the first week and a camper for the other two. The ages are close to his age and that gets tricky to be a monitor to your peers. Pray for him as he lives out his faith and helps in the preparation of camp by writing skits and planning the dramas. Avery will be a camper all three weeks. Please pray for Sharon and I to lead well and have renewed energy each week so these campers that the Lord is bringing don’t get “leftovers”.

Aida leaves on June 1 to fly to California and will be attending Riverside Community College in Riverside beginning in August. She is also going to be working on getting her drivers license. It will be hard to not have her with us on a daily basis but I am excited to see what the Lord has in this next season for her!
