We send you "warm" greetings from our hot and humid Rio Grande Valley in Southwest Texas. Our summers down here often remind me of what the Lord has spared us from in eternity. Of course, we have also been blessed with some very good showers, and for that, we are thankful. Heat and humidity, however, in no way takes our joy from what God is doing in and through us in Maranatha and in Cuba.

On this brief letter we'd like to highlight two important items:

1. Health: For the last 6 weeks I have been experiencing certain physical challenges such as, major weakness, fatigue, body aches, a drop in iron and lingering effects from dengue fever that I picked up in Cuba. Of course, the pace at Maranatha, especially starting our small groups ministry since the first week of January, has also taken a toll on my body. After a series of exams, special time in prayer and counsel from godly men I admire and respect, I have decided to take three weeks off from ministry. I have chosen this coming Monday June 13 to be my first day to leave town, probably to San Antonio. During these days, Mary and I will take advantage to celebrate our 30th wedding anniversary (June 14) and other special B'days, like on June 17 and 26. My dear wife deserves a medal for putting up with me. I am eternally thankful for her, as my wife and ministry partner. Sylvia's b'day is on August 6. By the way, her aortic dilatation has further increased, especially with her growth spurt. We would greatly appreciate your prayers. The time away from ministry responsibilities should greatly help me recover and to reenergize, especially in preparation for my next trip to Cuba in July (I know,

I don't learn, do I?). From July 14-26, I will be helping a group of students from Frontier School of the Bible (Wyoming) have a cross-cultural ministry experience in that island nation. One of my greatest joys has been to encourage and take along some of our own church people to Cuba. This time, I have the pleasure of taking under my wings our beloved Genesis. Some of you may recall 9 years ago, when I wrote about a young mother from our congregation who lost her life in a terrible car accident and having to break the sad news to a 9-year-old girl.
