

July Prayer Letter

Dear Friends,

July was a full month! Although we spent few days in Fraga, we have seen God at work all around Spain. We are so thankful for your prayers and support that have allowed us to travel safely.

The first activity I was involved in this month was an evangelistic campaign in La Nucía, Alicante organized by *Decision Spain*. They have been doing campaigns in Spain for over 50 years, sharing the hope of Christ in many churchless towns through films, conferences, concerts, and personal evangelism. Working with them and seeing their experience with these events firsthand was a huge blessing.

Our team was able to share Christ's love at a nursing home, in the streets, and also to teenagers and children in different events where the gospel was presented clearly and the audience was invited to make a decision for Christ. Throughout the campaign, several people understood the gospel and believed, praise God! Most of the people I talked with rejected Christ and were willing to believe in anything but the gospel. One example of this is a lady and her daughter who had many objections to Jesus. I listened and tried to build a

bridge from her beliefs to the scriptures, explaining what Christ has done. After some time, the daughter said—quite convinced— “I’d rather believe in aliens.” I invited them to join us for a movie night knowing they could see some of their objections answered in a dramatized way and also that they would get to hear the gospel one more time.

One of my goals for this trip was to evaluate how to do something similar in Fraga next summer or the following. Through the campaign, I would like to initiate an annual event as a platform for sharing the gospel with many people. I got lots of ideas and we need to pray much before going forward. We would really appreciate your help with this long-term prayer point. To have a campaign the upcoming summer, we need to make a decision by December.

After I came back from this event, we went to Logroño to see my parents. My mom is not doing well; please keep her in your prayers. Then we travelled again to participate in a church outreach near Barcelona with a mission team from our college. In the mornings, there were English classes for all ages and we helped students practice through reading and translating Bible verses. For one man, this was the first time he had entered an evangelical church after being invited by the pastor for over 10 years. He got to hear the gospel and we pray God will work in his heart. In the evenings, children attended Vacation Bible School and enjoyed story, craft, and game time. I was invited to preach and share about our ministry on Sunday.



Prayer Points

- Our ministry here in Fraga. August is vacation time for many Spaniards, so the *pueblos* usually get pretty quiet. We continue to ask God to open doors to minister to people and opportunities to share the gospel.
- My mom and dad as they are going through a hard time with my mom's aggressive disease.
- Last month we shared a prayer request for our cousin Austin in MN—while he still has a long recovery ahead, he is now out of the ICU, and we praise God for his progress!

- The decisions we make as we plan and organize the future of our ministry, especially regarding the campaign.
- I'm still actively seeking a part-time job to complete our budget and further engage our mission strategy.



We have had a great time this month serving the Lord, sharing the love of Christ, and fellowshiping with believers.

Your prayers and faithful support are invaluable to us. We thank God for each of you who have dedicated time, prayer, and resources toward our ministry and the work God is doing in Spain.
