Dear Family and Friends,

I just returned from a short but encouraging trip to Colca Canyon. The church at Pinchollo has been faithful in meeting Sundays and Tuesdays. This is a big step in the right direction. There was even a new person attending this time and she is very content to be a part of the church. This is the same church that hosted a convention a couple of months ago to dedicate the new building that they built. Daniel Saiko (the man that is teaching that



Christians can have demons and that diseases and that sins are really unclean spirits that need cast out) was present at the convention and presented these teachings. The main purpose for my trip to Pinchollo this time was to address these issues. I was worried that it would not go well, as these believers know Daniel and respect him as a leader and friend.



But God was working and they listened to me and I believe they understood the problems with Daniel's teaching. After meetings Saturday night and Sunday morning, all of them thanked us for coming and asked us when we were going to return. Addressing false teaching is one thing. Addressing by name a false teacher that is not viewed as such is another, more difficult thing to do. But the Holy Spirit provided wisdom and peace. Praise the Lord!

We did have to change the tire that we repaired from the last long trip I made. It looks like it is time to just buy a new tire as the tread appears to be separating in the area of the last repair. It really is abusive to the vehicles to drive on some of these roads. But God kept us safe once again as we noticed the problem before the tire actually gave us a problem.

Sunday afternoon we went to Paclla to visit Ubaldo and as always had a wonderful time of communion with him. He is 88, I believe, and is probably the most faithful of the believers in this part of the canyon. He and his daughter are the only Christians in their village. We then went on to Tapay were we met up with Godofredo and Puquios were we spent the night with Procarpio and Aureliana. Procarpio and his wife gave us a pickup load of lacoyote, a watermelon shaped squash that is used for a sweet pudding type of dessert.

Politically, things are fairly calm as everyone is getting ready for the special congressional elections in January. As you know, Latin American politics are never known for stability as we are not only seeing in Peru, but also in Venezuela, Chile, Bolivia, Ecuador, etc. But we are trusting in God. I Timothy 1:1-2 I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.

Recently two more boys from Belaunde, Ronal and Renato, asked how they could give their lives to Jesus. Ronal even asked with tears in his eyes, "Do you think God will give me another chance to give Him my life?" We had the wonderful privilege of seeing them both go to Christ for their salvation. These boys are 10 and 9 years old. Please pray that they will show the fruit of a transformed life and of a true conversion. Also pray for the young people that are now going to Belaunde to teach the kids.

In regards to our land in Uchumayo, we are finishing the fence so that by next week it should be finished. We still need to purchase and install two large doors for vehicle entrance and one smaller door for people. The property is roughly a ½ acre. I will send out another update with photos of that project when it is finished.
