We also had a chance to baptize Mari, a brand new believer in Christ who was so excited to obey the Lord that after her baptism, she invited us all to a special meal at her home. while Kim, Mary and I pushed on into San Juan y Martinez for further ministry opportunities already awaiting us there. Lodging in our new town was a bit challenging to find, yes, even finding two small rooms was a major thing to acquire. Transportation is another adventure in Cuba, so we were very happy to find accommodations only a few blocks from church. On Saturday morning, all three of us joined Tip of Spear ministry group in doing personal evangelism. This activity is something that this group does every single Saturday

morning. Our Maranatha church in McAllen has been privileged in financially helping Tip of Spear purchase a motorized bicycle. This is greatly helping this 40 member strong group to be a bit more mobile. Additionally, our own Tentmakers Bible Mission has also come along with just over 22 hundred dollars to help in this special need. So, the Tip of Spear evangelistic group in San Juan y Martinez now has two 2 wheel motorized bikes and Emilio in Santa Lucia has about 50% toward his. We are so overjoyed at the special interest and burden that others have tangibly expressed on this urgent need. Thank you! Should you feel moved by the Lord to contribute to this special project, please feel free to contact me. These Cuban brothers and sisters are fully committed to the physical task of personal evangelism and church planting. Maybe we should also feel compelled to come alongside them and financially help them in take the gospel to their surrounding villages with better means of transportation. What say you?

We are currently planning to go once again in August, taking along two of Maranatha church our youngsters. This exposure is our practical plan introduce these kids to missions as the Lord has so laid it on our hearts. I honestly feel that before my departure from this planet, I should earnestly seek to prepare the next generation to go from a "me" to a "them" mentality. Furthermore, we are also projecting a small



medical team for November of this same year. The major crisis on the most basic medical essentials is absolutely incredible. For example, there are many hospitals with absolutely NO syringes, surgical gloves, blood pressure meters and so many of the most fundamental medical needs. We were simply amazed at this great crisis and our very hearts were completely broken. Now our November trip is not only intended as a social help venture, but we seek to use the severe crisis on medicine and equipment, as a means to connect with the culture and expose them to the gospel. As mentioned before, Mary and I had been contemplating the idea of taking a ministry break after our Cuba trip last month. Not only did TBM accept our proposed 3-month Sabbatical request, but also our own Maranatha church wholeheartedly agreed. We are so very happy for unanimity on this much-needed time to rest, rejuvenate, and reconnect with our 3 adult daughters, son-in-



law and our beautiful grandbaby. This will also give us the time to go to Panama and visit my mother-inlaw, who just suffered a stroke. However, right before leaving McAllen, my own stepmother would reach the end of her own life. She died peacefully at age 97 on Sunday March 1. After her funeral, we left McAllen to start our Sabbatical three days after we had originally programmed. We currently find ourselves in Dallas, with Priscilla, her husband Brad and their almost 9 month old baby Oliver and Sylvia. From here we go back to San Antonio with Sarai and from there to Panama.
