Growing up in southwest Nebraska, I remember well the days of fall. I especially have fond memories of this time, due to "hunting season." Sometimes we would wake early in the morning, before the sunrise even, and head out to the lake to

do some bird hunting. I can recall the coolness of the air, and the wet smell that comes with early morning Autumn. Before the sun comes up, and melts away the mist, and lights everything else up...there is a thick fog that lies ahead. Before you can actually go out to do some hunting, it requires the taking of time: just waiting and watching for the sunrise. I remember in those moments of eager anticipation for what the dawning of this new day would bring, and wondering what excitement and adventure awaited...that at the very same time, there was also a quiet peace, as I silently sat and passed the time. I remember as a boy, just resting and waiting for when the time was right, when we were ready to make a move forward, when we could "go ahead." And I can even remember a mixture of emotions: impatience sometimes, but also quiet contentment at others. But always, grateful I got to be there. Normally, I would be "beside myself" with worry, trying to figure out our next steps, where we will go, what we will do, and how we will do it...with the Lord's help, of course. But right now, I am quite content to let HIM be the ONE Who is in complete control (as He actually already always is), and to just "be still, and know that HE is God" and I am not. Even when I have no idea what the future holds...I DO know the One Who holds it in His very able hands. And I also know that He loves me, He knows best, and He has good plans for me and my family. While I wait for this "foggy, misty time to clear up, with the warm rays of light of the morning" I get to rest in my Heavenly Father to let me know when the time is right to make a move, taking our next steps forward.

And I am so very grateful I get to be there for them during this tough transitional time: helping with homework, projects, attending their events, etc. I see it as a big blessing to be able to take care of my family in such a tangible way: with my presence and my personal assistance.

Ellie has stepped completely out of her comfort zone, with working at the school. She loves to just be at home, with those she is most familiar with (her family). But I am so blessed to be able to be there for her, support her, and help her, as she steps out in faith to allow the Lord to use her in the lives of others, outside of our own home.

And although I am not yet "officially" working or "doing ministry" I am keeping quite busy myself! In addition to various projects and things to do around the house, I have had the privilege of being involved in a variety of other things in the community. I have filled in for preaching a couple times, helped with "meals on wheels for the elderly," am participating in the midweek Bible study, and aim to start up a Bible study for men sometime soon. I have given my resume to the local church here, for the position as pastor. Their flock is in need of a shepherd, and I LOVE to lead others in the Lord, through His Word! If the Lord allows me this platform through such a position, I would be both humbled and grateful! But if this is not in His plan for our family right now, I will also be thankful for His involvement and clear direction in our lives. Please pray that the Lord will allow "doors" to open and close very clearly. As a good friend of ours once said "not just a crack open" where we might be tempted to "get our foot in the door" and try to pry it open. And as someone else once said "not a glass

door either" where we try to walk through a closed door and run straight into it! :)
