Then, at the end of January, her school opened back up completely. Our daughter was so excited to do her very first week of five days in the classroom! Amplified Pain Syndrome

Our daughter has been suffering with daily pain since she had Lyme disease a year and a half ago. We assumed it was chronic Lyme and there was not much that the doctors could do for her. This fall we set up a doctor appointment to find out if there was anything that could possibly be done. She was referred to a number of specialists and had an x-ray, MRI, and several blood tests done. All the specialists agreed that she is not suffering from chronic Lyme, but that she has a chronic amplified pain syndrome. They said that it could have been triggered by the Lyme, which is why it started at the same time. This was actually great news because this condition is treatable! The final doctor they saw was one at the Pediatric Pain Clinic. He confirmed the diagnosis, and she was put on a waiting list to start a ten-week program of treatment at the Pain Clinic. We just recently had her first appointment on February fifteenth, and it went well. Please


