We had a bit of a scare in our family when Cassandra hurt herself playing on some barrels (pictured in the header). She opened a huge gash/hole in her forehead, and there was lots of blood. (We'll spare you pictures.) After the possibility of skin grafts and extensive surgery, the doctors were able to stitch it up without any of that. It took 30 stitches in two layers. We are so grateful that she is healing now, and she is quite excited to have a scar. It was a great encouragement to get texts and messages from so many who were praying for her and us. The children (and their parents!) were a little traumatized by the event, but we are all recovering now, and reminding her to take a break from rollerblades and rough play for a while. God continues to provide for us, as the money we were looking to spend on a vehicle was ready to use for medical bills. Not how we planned it, but God knew what we would need.

## **Reading and Writing at TBM**

At the beginning of the year, Nathaniel and Chuck set some goals for the work at TBM. Nathaniel is currently working on three courses of study: Genesis, Colossians, and Christian Living. The *Genesis* study will focus on Theology Proper, as well as studies of man, angels, and sin. *Christian Living* is largely topical, using Galatians as a starting point and drawing largely on the Epistles and teachings of Jesus. *Colossians* will focus particularly on Christology.

The research is also fascinating, studying not only Bible for these courses, but books on anthropology, missiology, and communication. Reading and discussing these things is so refreshing and thrilling, as they are the topics that so often occupied my mind, and I am learning there are whole sets of terms and definitions by people who have studied so far beyond my independent musings.
