



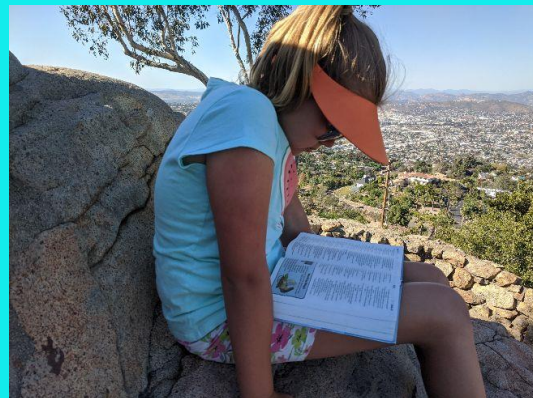

Remembering the Life and Ministry of Pastor Ray Hahn.



On May 3rd, Pastor Ray Hahn, 98, was welcomed home to heaven.

It is hard to put into words or easily summarize what Pastor Ray meant to the lives of the Gonzalez family and even to the Bennett family. Ray was the pastor who first drove Sara's mother Ruth down to Mexico to begin what she then thought was a short-term summer ministry in San Quintin during her summer college break in 1974. The Hahns never lost touch with Ruth or Alejandro and stayed in contact until Ray's death this week. He tirelessly worked building and improving El Buen Pastor Hospital in San Quintin during six decades, always showing his desire to work as hard as possible to extend the testimony of Jesus. He performed our wedding, was a dear role model and grandfather figure all of Sara's life and we lived adventures with Ray and Jackie in four different countries.

We are sure Pastor Ray is overjoyed to be with his Savior whom he served so faithfully and with his beloved Jackie, his bride of almost 75 years. What a blessed hope there is for all who accept the free gift of Christ (Romans 5:14-16).
