We were able to celebrate the New Year in Logroño with my family. I also had a chance to preach at the church there. We hadn't been there for some time, and it was very nice to catch up with everybody. I preached from Colossians 3:1-4, challenging us to evaluate our relationship with God and make an intentional commitment to work out our sanctification in light of our identity.

For Christmas, for the first time, we hosted a church service at our home. We invited Alberto and his family, and my dad and sister were also here visiting us. Thus far, we have been studying the Bible together in small groups, and we meet in person whenever restrictions and schedules allow, every time in a different location.

We went to see the place a couple times and got an idea of what it would take for us to renovate it in order to meet the requirements for a place of worship here in town. We made an offer, but the owner decided to rent the place to someone else at the last moment. Although we thought it would have been great, God is showing us that it isn't the right place for the church.

These past months have been filled with visits and activity, a happy change in

spite of the pandemic. In October, we enjoyed spending time with Maddy's parents and grandmother. They have been a ceaseless encouragement to our ministry and family, and we were delighted to be able to share our life in Spain with them.

In November, something really cool happened. A man reached out to us. Sani had been looking for a church in this area and our church's website came up. He was born in an Arab country and challenged Islam since he was a child. He had questions about God but never got the answers he needed from Islam until someone shared the gospel with him, he met Jesus, and his life was changed forever. He has an amazing testimony and he is constantly sharing the gospel with coworkers and people when he can. He is a blessing to our small group and has given us a very real perspective to some verses in our Bible study.

For example, we were studying the man born blind (John 9) and Sani shared with us the story of his family and society rejecting him. Jesus didn't leave the man born blind to his own fate. In John 9:35, Jesus heard what had happened and was there for the man. He was not left alone. From that, we were able to reflect on the presence of God in Sani's life and our lives as well.
