

Dear Family and Friends,

February in Peru is *residency renewal month* and this year it is also *get a new ID card month* for me. And on top of that, this February is *get a new ID card month* for Ángela. The one good thing that COVID has given us here in Peru is an online process for doing these things instead of waiting half a day in line just to be told that I forgot some document. As of today, my residency has been extended 2 years and Ángela's ID is done (just need to pick it up). Now all we need is my new ID card, which should be ready in a couple of weeks.

In January, we went to Callalli in the upper end of Colca for a young people's conference. As you can see it snowed crossing the pass. I had the opportunity to share a message about the dangers and blessings of technology and also a couple of messages about being

a young person of God. Ángela was also able to share with the ladies about living a holy life. We pray that God will raise up some young people there in Colca to be the next generation of church leaders in their villages. All-in-all we had around 70 young people in attendance from various villages and some from Arequipa. I want to say that I am very impressed with the young people from the church here in Arequipa for their initiative in organizing the conference. They are a good group and are very active in the Lord's work.



The work in Rosario (Uchumayo) continues. The attendance goes up and down. Last week we had 13 kids but thankfully a few of the young people from Arequipa were there to help out. A number of the kids have some pretty worn out shoes and we're looking into the cost of shoes as maybe we will be able to find an economic solution. Please pray for us that we would have God's wisdom in what to do and how to do it.

Also, in January, Ángela was asked to stream a lecture on healthy eating post-pandemic for the teachers of one of the private schools here in Arequipa. Nutrition is her specialty and so it was nice for her to get that opportunity. It also was a great way to earn a few dollars without leaving the house.

One last note, today we received notice that immigration has accepted Ángela's application. It's a month late, but at least the process goes on. Our lawyer is filing a couple of documents and within 2-3 days we will start working on the final requirements before scheduling a visa



interview. If I understand correctly, this will probably take around 3 months. If all goes well without any long delays or hiccups, then we should be able to schedule a trip to the US sometime in the summer to continue with the citizenship process and also to visit as many of you as we can before returning to Peru.

Thanks for your faithful prayers and support. Know that you too, are a part of God's work here in Peru.
