We have viewed our little store front building as a tool to reach people with the good news of grace and the love of Jesus. Over the last 6 months we have seen our 1,700 SF building shrink as more people have come.

We also are excited with how we are using the building through the week. We have a homeschool group meet weekly. There will also be a "Lego Group" and a Tae Kwon Do studio using our space consistently.

All of the above has caused us to start the search once again for a bigger space. We have our eyes on a 3,700 SF building. The owner is asking \$5,600 per month.

This coming Sunday we will be having a meeting with our group to decide if this is affordable and something the entire group can get behind. We are asking for unity and faith to follow God's leading.
