August 6th, the church in Ciudad Blanca had "Culto en el Campo" (Service in the Countryside).

Floro has a small house in the country and so we had services there and then played volleyball, ate a huge lunch, and did a lot of visiting. All-in-all it was a great day.

However, this week we spent two days with some of my in-laws being tourists in Colca. My sister-in-law used to be a tour guide and took us up to see some old tombs from the time of the Incas. We saw a lot of bones. One thing we didn't see was hope. The other thing we didn't see were all the items they were buried with them, as the Spaniards robbed the graves looking for gold to make the church bells for the village of Corporaque. Of course the bell was used for announcing the catholic mass, which is a continual sacrificing of Christ again and again. What a sad legacy. I can't say how many verses and texts came to mind but it was a lot.
