Way

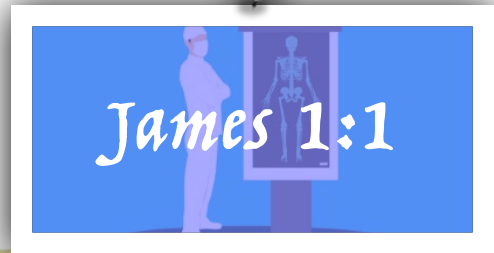

We decided that if God didn't provide a place by the end of our visit, then we would pack everything back up and move back to Michigan. The pastor knew of someone in the congregation who has various properties he likes to make available for ministry purposes. We got in contact with the gentleman, and he said he had one place that was currently available. Praise God for the direction and provision!

We have been greatly encouraged here in Pennsylvania by people's enthusiasm and interest to reach the 99% of unsaved nationals. I don't think I've ever shared our approach to support raising in a newsletter. Our perspective is that God has people and churches whom He is calling to partner in this mission of His. We move forward in faith that He directs-

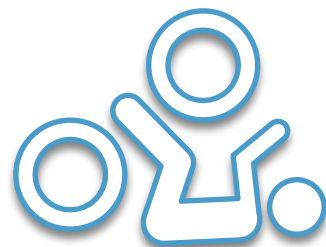
