Dear Family and Friends,

First of all, thank you for your prayers for the evangelistic event in La Molina the 21st of February. We didn't have as many people as we had hoped but we still had close to fifty that showed up. They seemed open to the gospel and thanked us for coming. We also had several from our Bible study group in Rosario that came and helped set up and serve in various capacities. Also, two of the youth and one of the elders from Ciudad Blanca went with us to help out where needed.



We were able to meet Christian, a young boy that was attacked by three dogs last year and had to have surgery on his ear and nose. Christian's dad and aunt were there also and we had a good conversation with them. Only one person that we talked with seemed to be a believer. The rest of the people are lost. After the event we took the workers back to our place in Rosario where some of the ladies had been cooking lunch for all of us. It was a really great opportunity for the folks in Rosario as they had a chance to serve the people in La Molina or serve the workers that went with a big lunch.

Due to a large pipeline leak and burn-off here in the jungle, Peru now has an astronomic shortage of natural gas and propane. Since basically 100% of Peruvians use propane to cook with that means when the cylinder empties so does the cooking. Other world events have had the nice trickle down effect of raising gasoline and diesel prices and there is even talk of a possible shortage soon. And the cherry on top of



this wonderful dessert is a bridge closure in Uchumayo. There are only two routes out of Arequipa to go north to Lima, west to the coast or south to Tacna. Now there is only one. The congestion is so bad that a 40 minute commute from Rosario to Arequipa is now three hours. We are praying about what to do about the Bible study in the weeks to come. A six hour round trip drive in the middle of a bunch of desperate and frustrated drivers doesn't appeal to me. Please pray that the Lord will guide us during this time and that the gas and propane issues won't cause us problems.



As far as the house plans go, we do have the structural engineered plans in our possession. I talked with the architect today and she said she is just waiting on a couple of items from the electrical engineer in order to finalize the rest of the plans. We still have to do the



accumulation of lots before we apply for a building permit. And as I was reviewing the titles, I noticed that public records had written my name incorrectly. So that has now become the next thing on the list to complete. Will that be a quick thing or a long drawn out process? Only time will tell. Please continue praying for this process and wisdom in finding the right contractor.
