



Dear Family and Friends,

As many of you know, our Feb. trip back to Uganda has been postponed. Gregg has developed a hematoma behind the retina of his left eye. The doctor told him if he leaves the U.S. with this, he could be blind before he returns home. So, he has now had 2 shots in the eyeball. When he went for the 2nd shot, the doctor was shocked and amazed at the healing of his eye! We credit the Lord and your prayers on our behalf for this rapid and thorough healing. Yet this did not keep him from needing another shot on March 5th. We are anxious to continue our ministry in Mbale.

Because we have been kept here and because the pastors are really growing and starting to live transformed lives, Gregg came up with the idea of teaching the parables of Jesus while we are here on this side. We meet with the pastors through What's App on Monday for about an hour. After discussing the questions we've sent the week before, we send them our answers. Then on Tuesday we send them the next parable, references and questions for them to meet and discuss. They usually meet on Thursdays, sometimes for as long as 3-4 hours! As you can see in the above picture, they are meeting under the mango tree. They are loving this study and seem to be growing in their understanding. One is teaching the lesson on Sunday to his church. They are so excited they keep inviting more of their pastor friends! I have explained to them that a "small group" is 3-5 people, and they are growing beyond that. Now we will begin sending the parables and questions to other pastors in other locations!

We plan to return to Uganda as soon as the doctor releases Gregg. This time in the U.S. has given me time for discipleship on this side of the "pond." In the meantime, we will continue to

study along with the pastors. Thank you for your continued prayers and support in this time of resting in the Lord. We pray this note finds your family healthy and blessed. Please let us know your prayer requests.
