In the mean time Angela and I have both started Bible studies. Well, hers at least is a Bible study. She is using the "Seeking Him" by Nancy DeMoss. It seems to be going well so far and she has 15 or more ladies that are participating. I am teaching seven of the men from Ciudad Blanca in regards to Bible interpretation. The class will morph into a basic doctrine class and sprinkled throughout are methods for studying the Bible. I think it's been real good for them. I know for me it has been a blessing. I have my class on Monday evenings and Angela has her Bible study on Wednesday evenings.



Angela's grandpa had a mild stroke again and lost movement in his left side. Some of his strength has returned but he requires more attention now as it is very difficult for him to

stand, let alone walk. We have found some ladies that take turns to come and help much of the week. His retirement pension is sufficient for the time



being to afford this service. That being said, when we don't have someone here to help out, it really eats up our time and

energy. He is 102 years old and very hard hearted. Please pray that God will use all of this to soften his heart so that he can respond to the gospel. Also pray for Angela and I, that we would have the strength and patience we need at this time and also the wisdom in knowing how to balance our responsibilities between the family and the ministry.

Just this morning a dear friend and brother in Christ entered glory. He, Bob, and his wife, Noel, were my only contacts when I first came to Peru in 2015. Both his endurance in the work and his patience with the brothers were an example to me and I hope to follow Bob in this as Bob followed Christ.

Wednesday evening, May 6<sup>th</sup>, one of our helpers, Analy (Anna Lee), was traveling to Cusco by bus for a job interview, when the bus was involved in an accident that could have been much worse. We thank God that he protected all the occupants and especially Analy.
